Why study industrial design in Denmark with DIS:

- > Scandinavian design is one of the most recognizable and impactful styles in the world, blending traditional and modern with many of the world's most iconic designs hailing from Denmark.
- > Course-integrated study tours within Denmark and to neighboring countries will expose you to historical and modern architecture, buildings and urban space of Northern Europe.
- > Fall, spring and summer programs offered at DIS are taught in English from respected faculty who are also professionals in the field.
- > DIS provides opportunities for students to experience local culture with home stays, sports teams and clubs, student events or volunteering in the community.

No previous Danish language required. Program is taught in English. Must have a 3.0 GPA or higher to apply. Note: DIS programs fill up quickly - apply early!

To Apply:

1. Go to studyabroad.rit.edu and login to the **Compass** (application database) and search for DIS Copenhagen.

2. Meet with study abroad advisor Roseanne Hernandez rit.edu/global/AdvisorMeeting

Plan 6 months to a year in advance to ensure proper academic and financial planning.

Applying for **Fall** semester programs: March 15th

Applying for **Spring** semester programs: October 1st

Applying for **Summer** programs: March 15th
