

## **University Writing Requirements**

All BFA students must complete 3 Writing Intensive courses in their degree:

- 1) First Year Writing Course (W): ENGL 150, UWRT 150 or ISTE 110
- 2) Program Writing Intensive Course (WI-PR): NMDE 301
- Gen Ed Writing Intensive Course (WI-GE): Any Gen Ed or program writing intensive course. This can be used to fulfill any Gen Ed or Open elective.

## **RIT 365**

This course serves as an interdisciplinary catalyst for first-year students to learn about and access campus resources, services, and opportunities. It is also designed to challenge and encourage relationship-building and campus community life.

## **Art History Electives**

Art History electives are non-studio courses offered in CAD that are searchable in SIS with the Art History attribute of ARTH, and are 200 level or above.

# **Professional Electives**

Professional electives are courses offered by the following programs: GRDE, IGME, ISTE, IDDE, DDDD, SOFA or photography (PHAP, PHAR, PHFA, PHPJ, PHVM, PHPS).

### **CAD Studio Elective**

CAD Studio Elective is a course with a studio or lab component, per catalog restrictions.

## Perspectives

The 4 Liberal Arts **perspective** course categories are designed to introduce students to a variety of areas of inquiry that provide ways of knowing about the world. BFA NMD students must take a 100-level ARTH course for each of the Artistic and Global Perspectives, but can choose from any of the Ethical and Social Perspectives offerings.

# **Immersion**

The General Education **immersion** is a series of 3 related general education courses. This requirement supports deeper learning within a focus area and can sometimes even lead to an optional Minor with the addition of 2 courses. See the RIT Dubai website for a list of immersions available at the Dubai campus.

# **Math/Science Perspective**

All students must take a course that is designated either as a Mathematical Perspective, a Natural Science Perspective, or a Scientific Principles Perspective.

### Islamic Culture Course

All RIT Dubai undergraduate students are required by the UAE Ministry of Education to complete 1 course in Islamic Culture.
This can be fulfilled by:

1) ANTH 275 Global Islam OR

2) ANTH 265 Culture and Politics in the Middle East

These courses can be used to fulfill the Gen Ed or an Open Elective, or a relevant Immersion.

# **Open Electives**

Students in the BFA NMD program have 5 3-credit Open Electives to take as part of their program. These required courses can be chosen from any credit-bearing courses from any department and can also be used to fulfill an optional minor.

### Co-operative Education

Although co-operative education is not required for students in the BFA NMD program, Cooperative education, internships, and other experiential learning opportunities are encouraged.

### **Advising and Your Plan**

Your academic advisor is there to help you understand your requirements and plan your courses. You should meet with them regularly. This flowchart is only a recommended plan - your individual plan will be developed with your advisor. But you are responsible for verifying course offerings and prerequisites, and ultimately, for meeting your graduation requirements.
