Brazil trip reminders

The deadline to apply for the Honors Study Abroad trip, *Activism and Social Movements in Brazil* is <u>Sun. October 20th</u>. Please review the <u>budget worksheet</u> which provides the tuition costs and fees as well as the estimated costs for airfare and other out of pocket expenses. Please remember, <u>the Honors Program provides \$1,500 to students</u> who participate in the trip, and students can elect to use any portion of their \$500 grant to offset costs as well.

The course in support of the trip will meet in the spring '25 semester and will meet once a week. Students will be in Brazil from May 12-21.

Submit your intent to present <u>and abstract</u>: Honors Research and Creativity Symposium

Please follow the link below to indicate your intent to present at the 2024 Research & Creativity Symposium which takes place on Saturday, December 7 from 8:30 am - 12:30 pm in the SHED rooms 3300 and 3350.

Please review the information below before submitting:

- <u>Completing the Intent to Present now includes a section for a brief abstract (rather</u> than collecting that at a later date)
- All research presentations will be in the form of a poster presentation / presentation of artwork there are no lecture style presentations this year
- The Honors office will support students in the printing of posters up until Sun. Nov 17
- You can use your Honors grant to pay for the cost of printing
- Creative presentations can be in the form of a poster, or depending on the project and logistics can present the artwork itself (a painting, sculpture, media presentation, etc.)
- Each presenter will have approximately 25-30 minutes to present
- Students can present independently or with a student or faculty co-presenter (can be a non-Honors student)
- Presentations at the R&CS fulfill the presentation requirement for an Honors Option
- The R&CS will be open to the RIT community

Program Reminders, Updates, and Tips

Submitting for Honors Points:

- If you are unsure whether an experience will be approved for Honors Points please contact the Honors office *before* taking part in the activity / experience. This is especially important when fulfilling your *Honors in the Discipline* requirement.
- It is your responsibility to submit for Honors Points for all experiences <u>EXCEPT</u> for Honors classes (classes that have the "H" attribute on your schedule).
- Students should submit for Honors Points as soon as the activity or experience has been completed.
- When submitting for points, please provide as much information as possible to help us streamline the processing of your submission.
- Verification emails are sent to faculty, advisors, co-op / internship supervisors / and Honors Advocates to approve your activity.
- Points awarded are equal to credits <u>EXCEPT</u> for the following types of activities:
 - **Faculty Sponsored Research** Points are awarded based on the time that you commit to the project:
 - o 60 hours earns 1 point
 - o 120 hours earns 2 points
 - o 180 hours earns 3 points
 - Non-Required Co-Op / Internships and Non-required Study Abroad or Study Away- Points are awarded based on the number of weeks you commit:
 - o 1-3 full weeks of full-time work earns 1 point
 - o 4–9 full weeks of full-time work earns 2 points
 - o 10 full weeks or more of full-time work earns 3 points
 - Competitive Fellowships and Awards <u>One point</u> is earned by <u>completing an application</u> for an eligible international fellowship through RIT Global; eligible programs include the Marshall, Mitchell, Rhodes, Schwarzman, Churchill, and Fulbright (full, not summer).
 At most 1 point, total


