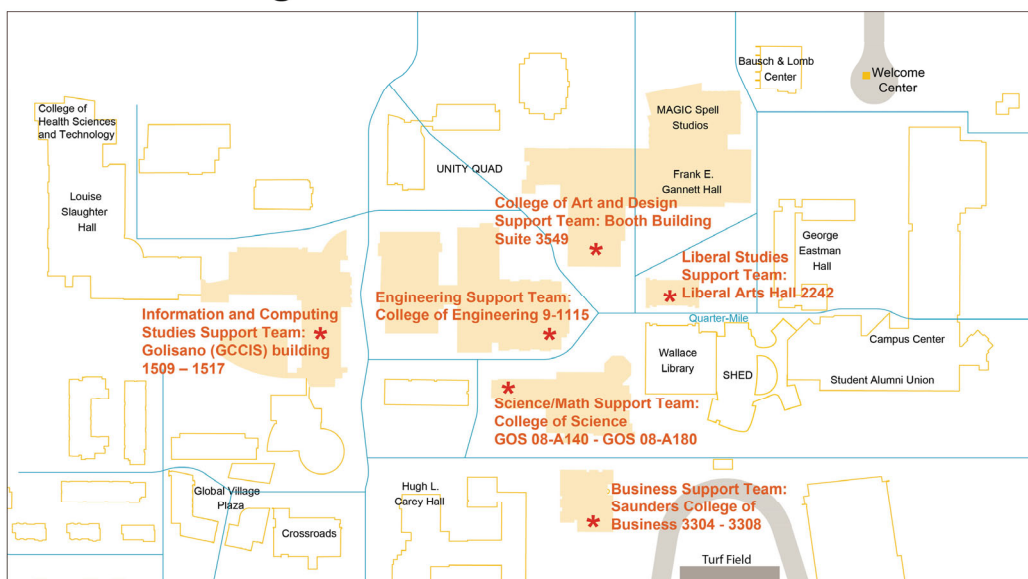
Deaf Students at RIT

- NTID's primary mission is to promote the employment of persons who are deaf by providing technical and professional education.
- NTID grants AOS/AAS/AS and MS degrees, and recently added some BS programs.
- NTID's secondary mission is to prepare professionals in fields related to deafness.







Deaf Students at RIT

- Deaf students who attend the other colleges at RIT are called **Cross-Registered** or NTID-Supported. They can be direct 'admits' to those colleges or come from an A+B program.
- There are currently 430 Cross-Registered and 404 NTID undergraduates (and 161 BS-level students) on campus.
- There are 68 deaf graduate students across other colleges and 81 graduate students in NTID programs.

Academic Support

- **RIT/NTID Support Coordinators:**
 - Work closely with DAS (access services)
