HEARING LOSS can have a devastating effect on a young child. Hearing impaired children need very special interaction in order to communicate and learn. Although impaired speech is the most obvious effect of deafness, more serious are the lack of normal language development, social and emotional isolation and an inability to get information about the world.

The child sees much, but his parents cannot explain the world to him. The child wonders but cannot ask.



The Parent-Infant/Toddler Program is for children birth to $2^{1/2}$ years old who are hearing-impaired or who are hearing and live with a deaf parent or sibling.

ISCOVERING that your baby is hearing impaired can shatter a parent's confidence. "How can I take care of my baby?" "What does my baby need?" These are questions which are often asked by parents.
