## Featured Programs

### RIT Croatia - Summer

#### Global Communication (Dubrovnik)

Spend five weeks strengthening your cross-cultural communication skills while taking two communication courses. Includes a one-week study tour to Greece. *Courses taught in English.*

#### Summer Psychology (Zagreb)

Explore the rich history and cultural influences of modern psychology on this five week summer program. Take two psychology courses (Abnormal Psychology and Positive Psychology). Includes a one-week study tour to Austria and Germany. *Courses taught in English.*

### Malmo University

#### Malmo, Sweden

##### RIT Exchange Program, Fall or Spring semester

Malmo is considered one of the most inventive cities in the world and Malmo University is an active hub for research, education and innovation. Gain a cross-cultural perspective with coursework in communications and media, criminal justice, international relations, public policy and philosophy. *Courses taught in English.*

## When You Should Go

The College of Liberal Arts study abroad pathways identify the optimal timing for semester-long study:

Advertising/PR	2nd year, spring
Communication	2nd year, spring
Criminal Justice	4th year, fall
Digital Humanities	2nd year, spring
Economics	2nd year, spring
International & Global Studies	3rd year, fall
Journalism	2nd year, spring
Museum Studies	2nd year, spring
Philosophy	2nd year, spring
Political Science	3rd year, fall
Public Policy	3rd year, fall
Psychology	3rd year, fall
Sociology & Anthropology	3rd year, fall

However, work with your academic advisor to determine the best timing for you.

## Scholarships

All College of Liberal Arts majors/double majors would receive the COLA Global Opportunity (GO) Grant - an automatic \$500 grant to study abroad.\*

RIT Education Abroad Travel Grants (\$500-\$1,000) are available for global campus, faculty-led or exchange programs.

Gilman study abroad scholarship awards funding up to \$5,000. Must be U.S. citizen and receiving Pell grant to be eligible to apply ([gilmanscholarship.org](http://gilmanscholarship.org))
